HOLIDAYS SURE TO BE FULL OF CHEER AS *ELF THE MUSICAL*RECEIVES DC RESIDENT THEATRE PREMIERE

Broadway musical is based on one of the most popular modern Christmas movies

Olney, MD — October 16, 2018 — Olney Theatre Center continues its tradition of holiday musicals with the Resident Regional Premiere of *Elf the Musical* from November 9, 2018 - January 6, 2019, directed by Michael Bobbitt. Bobbitt, who choreographed the holiday hit *Guys and Dolls* in 2015, is joined by choreographer **Tara Jeanne Vallee** who choreographed the 2016 *Mary Poppins* as well as this past summer's *On the Town*. Press is invited to attend the performance on Thursday, November 15 at 8:00pm.

"Holiday musicals for the entire family are an Olney Theatre tradition, and we're lucky this year to have snagged the rights to the resident professional premiere of *Elf the Musical*," said Jason Loewith, Artistic Director of OTC. "Two of my favorite artists - director Michael Bobbitt and choreographer Tara Jeanne Vallee - are bringing it to life for us, with an outrageously talented ensemble including OTC music-theater phenoms Patricia Hurley (*Mary Poppins*), Kevin McAllister (*Annie*), Nova Y. Payton (*Godspell*), David Schlumpf (*South Pacific*), and Bobby Smith (*On the Town*)."

David Schlumpf stars as Buddy, a human accidentally transported to the North Pole as a baby and raised there with the misbelief that he, like everyone around him except Santa (played by **Kevin McAllister**) and Mrs. Claus is an elf. Upon learning the truth, he journeys to New York City to find his father (**Bobby Smith**). Arriving in the big, bad city, he is distraught to learn that his birth father is on the "naughty" list and that his half-brother Michael (**Tyler Smallwood**) doesn't believe in Santa. Luckily, Buddy makes some new friends in the city, including love-interest Jovie (**Patricia Hurley**), his step-mom Emily (**Janine Sunday**) and even Walter's secretary Deb (**Nova Y. Payton**). Even still, things go badly with his father and Buddy seems more lost than ever, but when Santa's sleigh is stranded in New York, Buddy rallies those around him to help Santa and save Christmas!

Completing the Ensemble of elves, santas, (both "authentic" and "department store") and Manhattan inhabitants is: Jessica Bennett, Michelle Carter, Jennifer Flohr, Isabel Garcia, Andre Hinds, Marty Austin Lamar, Calvin McCullough, Christian Montgomery, Taylor Elise Rector, Connor James Reilly, Sarah Anne Sillers, David Singleton and Lara Zinn. Eli Langer serves as the standby for the role of Michael, while Ashleigh King is scheduled to take over the role of Deb from December 26 through the end of the run. Amanda Kaplan and James Mernin serve as swings.

Bobbitt's creative team, in addition to Vallee, includes **Angie Benson** (Music Director), **Daniel Ettinger** (Set Designer), **Kendra Rai** (Costume Designer), **Max Doolittle** (Lighting Designer), **Kylie Clark** (Puppet Designer), **Sarah Tundermann** (Projections Designer), **Matt Rowe** (Sound Designer) and **Dori Beau Seigneur** (Wig Designer). **John Keith Hall** is the stage manager.
